

BURDENSOME "HOLINESS"	BEAUTIFUL HOLINESS
Holiness is my performance for God (and for others who might be watching).	Holiness is God's beauty-making project in me (which I get to join in on). "May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through" (1 Thessalonians 5:23).
I can dress myself up, but I feel like God knows the truth. I look pretty ugly to him, not at all holy.	Praise God! I know that in the past, at the cross, Jesus died for my sin and God declared me holy. Holy is my identity before God—who I really am. "You were washed, you were sanctified" (1 Corinthians 6:11).
I try to work on being holy, but it's hard and I fail all the time. I feel as if Jesus is looking down on me, impatient, and constantly disappointed in what he sees.	Praise God! I know that in the present God is actively working in my life, patiently teaching me to live like the holy person I am. What a privilege! What loving care! "We all are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory" (2 Corinthians 3:18).
I want to go to heaven, so I guess I better work on holiness.	Praise God! I know that in the future, when this life is over, God will make my holiness complete. Holiness now is hard, but I work at it because I'm eager to live like a citizen of heaven, bound to feast with Jesus. "When Christ appears, we shall be like him" (1 John 3:2).
Being holy is first of all about measuring up to external rules others will notice and approve of.	Being holy is first of all an attitude of my heart. "Create in me a pure heart, O God" (Psalm 51:10).
I feel a need to define holiness in ways that make it doable on my own, so I end up compromising with morality and worldly idols—and trying to hide those compromises.	Jesus is my captain in my fight for holiness, so I take on all holy-living challenges and dare to expose all kinds of sin in my life. "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline" (2 Timothy 1:7).
My holiness is mostly limited to a <u>physical</u> set-apart-ness. It's about what I may watch, where I may go, whom I may be with, etc.	My holiness goes deeper, becoming a <u>character</u> set-apart-ness. It's about how I love, rejoice, repent, trust God, put myself last, etc. "Set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12).
Holy living is chiefly about withdrawing from the culture around me in an attempt to stay pure.	Holy living is chiefly about <u>reaching</u> <u>out</u> to others and sacrificially loving them in an attempt to display the beauty of Jesus. "Now that you have purified yourselves by obeying the truth so that you have sincere love for each other, love one another deeply, from the heart" (1 Peter 1:22).





